THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BLUE GRASS CITY COUNCIL BLUE GRASS, IOWA JUNE 16, 2025

The Blue Grass City Council met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on the 16th day of June 2025, in the City Council Chambers of City Hall, 114 N. Mississippi Street, Blue Grass, Iowa, pursuant to law, with Mayor Brad Schutte presiding, with a Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of reflection.

Council present: Smith, Brandenburg and Blok. Hermann arrived at 7:04 p.m. Absent was member Bowman.

Mayor Schutte read aloud the Mayoral Comments.

PUBLIC FORUM: Resident Mike Houy expressed his disappointment in the Council's decision not to move forward with the removal of tree debris in the ditch at Lauretta Park. Discussion was held on the extent of the work needed to remove the tree debris and install a culvert costing the City approximately \$25,000.00 to \$30,000.00. Mayor Schutte asked that Meyrer follow up with the contractor and report back to the Council.

The Clerk reported that Public Works had \$15,000.00 left in the budget. 26. Orphed Street Improvements: City Engineer Mike Janecek reported that he had met with the Public Works Director to find a solution to correct the drainage issues on both East and West Orphed Street

reporting that he felt that by installing storm intakes and connect to existing storm intakes could potentially be a solution with estimated costs of approximately \$77,875.00 which includes removing and replacing existing asphalt and/or concrete, mobilization, paint pavement markings and surveying and engineering. Discussion was held. It was the consensus of the Council to have the Engineer proceed with elevation shots and bring back his findings at the next Council meeting.
